The client

Powys Teaching Health Board is responsible for meeting the health and well-being needs of the people of Mid Wales.

The brief

The existing Llewellyn ward did not comply with the latest regulations in terms of bariatric access and fire escape routes. The scheme was to enlarge the main entrance to the ward by building a small extension alongside it to create a more accessible route. A large external ramp was also built to make the ambulance station wide enough to accommodate all patients.

Project delivery

The project was carried out whilst the ward was live and our site management team had daily meetings with the attending ward management to discuss the days events, enabling us to plan our work around the ever-changing day to day activities.

One of our daily challenges was to maintain a safe escape route for our contractors who had to work in agreed areas whilst keeping all routes clear. Whilst the work was being carried out, we had to extend the fire protection routes. Meaning we had to build new fire barriers with temporary doors to ensure high safety standards were met throughout the project.

Working in a live environment did provided a challenge, but the project was completed successfully, on time and met the clients expectations.
